The Target Tattler is the newsletter of the Chicago Park District Archery Association which is composed of 3 archery clubs: the Chicago Archery Club, founded in 1878; the Lincoln Park Archery Club, founded in 1925; and the Gage Park Archery Club, founded in 1939.

- Spring is upon us and the 2004 summer archery schedule is enclosed. The archery tournament season begins Saturday, June 5th (with a 900-round, a total of 90 arrows, 30 arrows each at 60, 50 and 40 yards. The season ends Sunday, September 19th with outdoor championships and annual picnic. This also will be a 900-round.
- For those of you interested in participating in these informal tournaments, the distances are usually 40, 50 and 60 yards. Children shoot at 10, 20 and 30 yards. New this year, we will have a novice class, which will shoot at 10, 20 and 30 yards. We are trying to encourage new target archers to get involved in these club shoots and if you are capable of consistently hitting the target at these distances, please come and join us.
- We are continuing to offer archery clinics. This is made possible through the equipment loaned to us by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources. These clinics are for all ages and are usually held Saturday mornings from 11am-1pm. The shooting distances are 5 or 10 yards. We need instructors to help with this program and if you could spare even one Saturday, please contact Warren Levin at 847/347-7408.
- We are in the process of trying to build a new clubhouse. We've received a bid for approximately \$30,000 to rebuild our building. This roughly breaks out to be \$10,000 in materials and \$20,000 in labor. Tom Daniel is looking into ways we can do this with less of a labor cost. - We are working with Chicago Park District to put on a program for Chicago Day Camp participants.
 This will probably be held on Wednesday afternoons from roughly 2:30-4:30pm. If you can spare
 even one Wednesday afternoon during the summer to participate in this program, your help would be

- In an effort to provide instruction to members in our club, informal practices will be held on Wednesday evenings from 5:00pm until sunset and Saturday mornings. We've had many inquiries from people trying to improve their technique and this will allow the more experienced shooters in the club to pass their knowledge on to the newer members.

- The Lincoln Park Archery Club is a member of the National Field Archery Association (NFAA) and the Illinois Archery Association (IAA). - I would like to congratulate Warren Levin who in September was again crowned the overall champion of the Indoor and Outdoor Season.
- We just concluded the Indoor Season with the Indoor Championship on April 17, 2004. Bill Munson had a perfect indoor season and again won the free-style professional division with a perfect score of 300. Tom Daniel won the freestyle unlimited men's division with a score of 298. Louie Asanon won the men's freestyle limited division with a score of 254; Megan Lutz won the women's freestyle unlimited division with a score of 272 and Chuck Nadler won the senior freestyle unlimited men's division with a score of 273. Congratulations to everyone! We had 25 participants during the indoor season.
- Our goal in 2004 continues to be increase membership and proficiency of the members in the club, as
